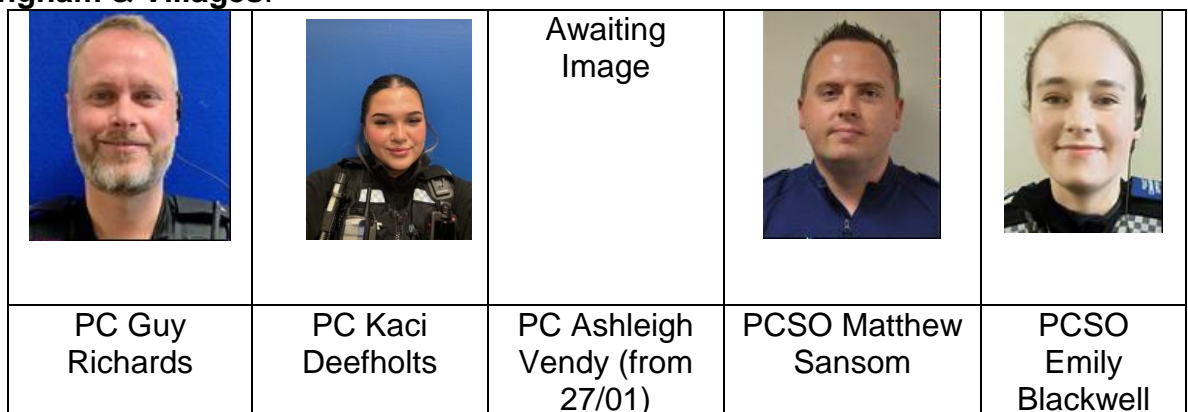
### Meet Your Neighbourhood Policing Team

Our dedicated Neighbourhood Policing Team is here to serve and support you. Leading the team are Inspector James Davies and Sergeant David Kuttner, who oversee the Buckingham & Villages, Winslow & Villages, Wing & Ivinghoe, and Haddenham & Waddesdon areas.

Our neighbourhood officers are committed to addressing local issues and work collaboratively with partner agencies, including the council, housing associations, and other emergency services, to tackle long-term challenges. ### Other News

The below is just a snapshot of what each of the neighbourhood teams have been doing over the last few months:

**Addressing Suspicious Behaviour in Buckingham:** In light of recent reports concerning a male engaging inappropriately with females on the outskirts of Buckingham Town, the Neighbourhood Team, in collaboration with our colleagues within the Harm Reduction Unit and Project Vigilant team, have been actively working with local businesses and residents. Our goal is to gather evidence and take decisive actions to ensure the safety of all residents. This effort is ongoing, and we remain committed to maintaining a secure environment.

**Tackling Anti-Social Behaviour:** In response to anti-social behaviour reported in and around Buckingham Town Centre and University properties, we have identified the individuals involved. By utilising Anti-Social Behaviour legislation, we have intervened to educate and reduce the impact of such behaviour on our community.

**Successful Buckingham Charter Fair:** Supported by neighbouring teams, we successfully policed the annual Buckingham Charter Fair. Aside from a few isolated incidents which are currently under investigation, the fair was a safe and enjoyable event for all attendees.

**Community Engagement Initiatives:** The Buckingham NHPT has conducted regular "Have Your Say" events, engaging with the community to gather feedback and prioritise

our policing efforts where they are most needed.

**Multi-Agency Collaboration:** Our team met with the local Family Hub Team and other agencies to enhance partnership and information sharing, thereby better supporting families in need.

**School and Community Group Engagement:** We continue to engage with local primary schools and community groups, demonstrating the role of neighbourhood policing, offering advice, and building strong relationships within the district.

**Addressing Crime in Stoke Hammond:** Following a series of incidents involving anti-social behaviour, theft, and burglary, we have recovered a stolen dog and are addressing these offenses with a robust multi-agency response.

**Adverse Weather Response in Wing & Winslow:** Despite a stormy winter, our NH teams have worked tirelessly to maintain open roads, assisted by local residents with power tools. We are grateful for the community's support.

**Poaching Arrests in Wing & Villages:** Routine patrols led to the discovery of poaching activities. After identifying a suspicious vehicle, officers from the Wing team stopped it and found it to contain dead pheasants, controlled drugs, offensive weapons and other equipment relating to hunting/ poaching offenses. The occupant was arrested. The ongoing investigation underscores the importance of community vigilance and reporting suspicious activities.

**Youth Engagement and Safety in Winslow:** Collaborating with Sir Thomas Freemantle School, we have implemented safeguarding measures, including a successful knife arch operation. Thankfully no weapons were found on site.

**Mounted Section and Community Relations:** PC Holman supported the Mounted Section's new facility opening, fostering collaboration between teams.

**Successful Arrests in Winslow:** The team has made significant arrests, including for domestic violence, knife offences, and drink driving, and other driving offences, ensuring justice and community safety.

**Community Activities in Waddesdon:** Our team has been actively involved in organising talks and attending local events, enhancing community engagement.

**Volunteer Recognition in Waddesdon:** We celebrated the hard work and dedication of our volunteers at a local event. Our volunteer's contributions have greatly enhanced our

policing efforts.

**Knife Sweeps in Haddenham:** Through Operation Sceptre, we conducted knife sweeps in local parks. The aim of this was to remove dangerous weapons which may have been concealed, and to promote safety in partnership with the community. Operation Sceptre is an initiative designed to combat knife crime.

**Scam Awareness in Quainton:** A successful scam awareness evening was held, educating residents on recognising and avoiding scams, reinforcing our commitment to community safety.

**Drink Driving Enforcement in Marsh Gibbon:** A repeat drink driver was apprehended and issued an extended ban, demonstrating our commitment to road safety in rural areas.

**E-Scooter Regulation:** Our team has been actively identifying and addressing the illegal use of e-scooters, issuing warnings, and educating the public on legal requirements.

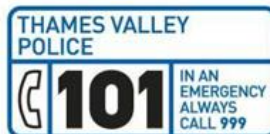
