



The south team have implemented the UKs first Nitrous Oxide (Nos) amnesty bin, this is locate at The South Court Baptist Church, Penn Road. Since being installed the bin

has been heavily used by the community with over 100 canisters being surrendered

During the summer months, the team have investigated, arrested, charged and remanded a male who has completed a series of shopliftings from the Co-op on Hannon Road. This male was causing the area a lot of anti-social behaviour, the team worked closely with other agencies to re house the male away from the area.

In response to reports of anti-social behaviour around the Walton Court shopping area and the Edingbrough playing fields the team have work tirelessly with the community, partner agencies and wider Police area and have made these areas a 'hot spot' this means officers from all of the Neighbourhood teams and our colleagues from the Respo9nce teams know about the issues and are all actively patrolling the area on a daily basis.

The team attended Ashmead primary school as part of their Emergency services week and have set up a mini crime scene with the children talking them through what happens when the Police receive a call, the children took swabs, lifted footprints and finger prints (and even took their own finger prints) looks at CCTV and entry and exit points until they were able to identify a suspect (their teacher!!) this was a fun and educational day.

The team have attended various events in the area including the South Court Baptist Church summer fete, the South Court Mosque summer event, Ashmead summer fete, recruitment event at the Gutman Centre,

The North Team

PCSO Lenard has attended a family day hosted at the Family Centre on Elmhurst lots of attendees were engaged with and some even go to try the Police riot uniform on!


PC Collins worked tirelessly to identify a male who was the suspect in an exposure in the Berryfields area. He was swiftly arrested and place on bail whilst the investigation is ongoing. The team have been out in the area since completing high visibility patrols

The team, working in conjunction with housing have successfully obtained a closure order at court, this order has made sure that the residents is getting the appropriate safeguarding from out partner agencies. Since this order was granted, we are pleased to say there has been no further issues from the address.

The team have attended Havlock Street Mosque and have given a crime prevention talk at Friday Prayers. They addressed the congregations due to ongoing fears amongst the community. Then engaged with numerous attendees afterwards.

The team have completed multiple have you say events in various locations over the North, these have all been well attended and supported by the community. The team have been patrolling local hot spot areas on foot, these include parks and the shopping parade.

The West Team

The team have opened Aylesbury's second community knife amnesty bin, this is located on Rochester Place, just behind the Co Op, since its launch over 50 knives have been surrendered. This bin has been extremely successful seeing a variety of knives being surrendered.


The team have investigated, arrested, charged and remanded a male and female who has completed a series of shopliftings from the Sainsbury on Gatehouse Road. The pair were causing a lot of ASB in and around the store and the team managed to secure charges on both which lead to a lengthy prison sentences.

After various reports of ASB and drug use in Whitehill park the team have been patrolling the park on a regular basis, engaging with the local residents and community, the team have seized some class B drugs of some members of the community who thought it was a good idea to smoke cannabis in public in the park.

The team have responded to reports of a male who was begging daily outside of the Co Op on Fairford Leys, he was causing a nuisance to members of the public and the store. The team worked closely with the store and the local council and issued this male with a community protection notice, within this notice he was banned from sitting outside of the store and begging. Since this notice was issued, he has not returned.

The team, working in conjunction with housing have successfully obtained 2 closure orders at court, these orders have made sure that the residents are getting the appropriate safeguarding from out partner agencies. Since these orders were granted, we are pleased to say there has been no further issues from the addresses.

The East Team

The Aylesbury East Community Policing team consists of Police Constable Olivia Pinnells along with community support officers Isabelle Fincher and Thomas Moslin

The team have increased patrols in Kingsbrook due to the ASB that was being committee over the summer months. Youths riding on mopeds and bikes in Kingsbrook over the summer, which was an ongoing issue. We gathered evidence, seized the bikes, and identified the children involved, they have since been spoken too and there have been no further issues!




Have Your Says within Kingsbrook to engage with residents about the issues. We also worked closely with the Tesco on Kingsbrook to collect CCTV and identify youths and encourage them to report any ASB being caused. It has now calmed down and we are on top of it.

The Bedgrove day in the park event was attended by the whole East Team, this was the first event in a few years and was widely supported by the community! The team spend the day engaging with everyone, the Police Horses even stopped by for a bit which went down

Along with the Roads to Policing the team have attended Kingsbrook Secondary School and have completed 3 assemblies talking to students about staying safe when cycling to school, road safety, the team have completed a speed gun demonstration with the

In the past 4 months the teams have made 23 arrests and completed 11 stop and searches.

Speeding Concerns: Speeding is a frequent concern in our villages. While speed enforcement can hold speeding motorists accountable, research indicates it is not the most effective deterrent. Instead, road layouts and other measures prove more successful. Nevertheless, our neighbourhood team has acquired speed guns and has been actively monitoring and catching speeding drivers. We will focus our speed enforcement efforts on areas identified by the community as problematic. If speeding is a concern to you, please look to become involved in the community speed watch programme (link at the end of the newsletter).

Parking Concerns: Parking is a common issue across all our areas, often leading to neighbourhood disputes and community tension. We provide advice on an individual basis and, in some cases, work with schools to send polite notices to parents where parking is an issue during drop-off and pick-up times. We also patrol during these times, leaving notices and issuing tickets where applicable. Consideration notices stating that Thames Valley Police (TVP) are aware and monitoring have been issued in peak areas to act as a deterrent in the absence of road markings.









