A guide to identifying victims of Cuckooing



Cuckooing is a practice where drug dealers take over a vulnerable person's property and use it as a base to deal drugs. Victims are often befriended by the dealers as they are vulnerable, isolated, and often drug users themselves. Victims are left with little choice but to co-operate. The tactic is known as **Cuckooing** – after the bird that invades the nest of other birds. We have produced a simple and memorable guide to help people identify and assist victims of **Cuckooing** using the acronym **N.E.S.T.**

Notice the signs

Increased anti-social behaviour (ASB) near a specific property, frequent visitors, curtains closed most of the time, needles and drug paraphernalia.

<u>E</u>vidence your concerns

Make a note of your concerns for evidential purposes – especially if you recognise individuals at the property.

<u>Safeguarding</u>

Complete a safeguarding referral. The resident may require support during this time. Visit **www.milton-keynes.gov.uk/adult-social-care** for further guidance.
