#### The South Team

The Aylesbury South Community Policing team consists of Police Constable Tom Cox, along with community support officers Rachel Matthews and Lee Abrahams.

The South team have had a very busy quarter, in August they have worked alongside, local charity, In This Together, the NHS and AVA secondary school to produce

an educational video to help the public raise awareness of the effects of the use of Notorious Oxide, offices from the team even appeared in the video!

During the winter months the team have gathered and built on intelligence on an address within the area they expected to be a potential cannabis grow. Officers successfully obtained a warrant from the courts and executed this early in the morning. Inside the address was the remains of a once active cannabis factory.

In response to reports of anti-social behaviour around the Walton Court shopping area and the Edingbrough playing fields the team have work tirelessly with the community, partner agencies and wider Police area and have made these areas a 'hot spot' this means officers from all of the Neighbourhood teams and our colleagues from the Response teams know about the issues and are all actively patrolling the area on a daily basis.

Officers have obtained intelligence on an individual who was believed to be supplying drugs within the community, another warrant was obtained and executed and a large amount of drugs were located, the person in question was arrested and has since been bailed for further enquiries.

The team have attended various events in the area including a presentation at the 7<sup>th</sup> Day Adventist church around crime prevention and drugs, have held multiple have your says with members of community, have assisted with a number of complex drugs investigations leading to positive charges, and dealt with a number of non-road worthy cars.

A speeding operation was conducted on the Ellen Road, we are happy to report back that no motorists were exceeding the speed limits!

**Speeding Concerns:** Speeding is a frequent concern in our villages. While speed enforcement can hold speeding motorists accountable, research indicates it is not the most effective deterrent. Instead, road layouts and other measures prove more successful. Nevertheless, our neighbourhood team has acquired speed guns and has been actively monitoring and catching speeding drivers. We will focus our speed enforcement efforts on areas identified by the community as problematic. If speeding is a concern to you, please look to become involved in the community speed watch programme (link at the end of the newsletter).

**Parking Concerns:** Parking is a common issue across all our areas, often leading to neighbourhood disputes and community tension. We provide advice on an individual basis and, in some cases, work with schools to send polite notices to parents where parking is an issue during drop-off and pick-up times. We also patrol during these times, leaving notices and issuing tickets where applicable. Consideration notices stating that Thames Valley Police (TVP) are aware and monitoring have been issued in peak areas to act as a deterrent in the absence of road markings.
