Are there expensive tools or other items left in it overnight?

If the answer is YES - please remove them (if possible) or risk thieves removing them instead.

Not possible to remove items?

- Consider parking in a way that blocks/restricts entry to rear/side doors (against a wall, back to back with another van etc).
- If possible, park in a well lit area and or close to CCTV cameras. Park near reception or close to building windows.
- Register your tools with a recording website such as immobilise.

Engrave tools with name or postcode - or permanently mark them.

Do not leave anything on display (yes, people still do).

Offences typically in hours of darkness - Patrols are being conducted to catch those responsible.

Following incidents of disorder in Wycombe last night, particularly in the Castlefield area, an arrest has been in relation to this and police are continuing to investigate.

Police will not be tolerating the behaviour seen last night under any circumstances. In response, a dispersal authority has been obtained for our most impacted area and is valid for the next 48 hours. This allows officers to direct individuals identified as likely to commit anti-social behaviour to leave the specified area. Individuals who are directed away from the area are not permitted to return until the dispersal authority expires. If found to be returning before then, this will then be a criminal offence and will be dealt with robustly. This legislation has been obtained to assist officers in protecting the public from further disorder in the days following. The area in which the dispersal authority has been enforced over is on the map below.

There will be a heightened police presence in the area today, with increased patrols being carried out to support the local community.

Matthew Wootten, pictured, was sentenced to two years and eight months in prison at Reading Crown Court yesterday.

Wootten was also disqualified from driving for three years and four months.

He previously pleaded guilty to dangerous driving, damaging property being reckless as to whether life is endangered and drink driving at the same court on 5 August.

Just after midday on 25 June, Wootten was driving a white Volkswagen Scirocco, which hit the barriers at the entrance to Chequers on Missenden Road.

Wootten was found to have a blood alcohol reading of 221mg of alcohol per 100ml of blood after the incident. The legal limit is 80mg.

In total, he caused £32,641 worth of damage to the Victory Gate and £6,000 of damage to the bollards behind it.

- 1. It is illegal to sell fireworks to under 18s.
- It is illegal for a person under 18 to possess an adult firework in a public place, this excludes sparklers, caps, cracker snaps, novelty matches, party poppers, serpents and throw downs.
 Fireworks can legally be set off between 7am and 11pm, and on Bonfire Night between 7am and
- midnight.

- Fireworks can distress very young or elderly people as well as pets please try to take steps to be considerate of your neighbours
- Fireworks can cause damage and serious injuries if not used properly

Now the clocks have gone back, the nights are longer and this gives criminals more opportunities to commit crime under the cover of darkness

Making sure your car windows and doors are locked without any valuables inside, parking in secure, well lit places and making use of CCTV for your driveway can play a big part in helping prevent car theft. If you have keyless entry on your vehicle there are additional tips to consider when it comes to securing your car:

Box It - place your keys in a metal tin to block the signal it emits from travelling any further. Bag It - another option is to purchase a signal-blocking pouch and keep your keys in this when they're not in use.

Block It - as an extra security measure, where possible, consider using other vehicles to block your key less car in so it can't be easily driven away.

Dock it - use old school security, such as a steering lock or wheel clamp to prevent the vehicle from being moved even if they gain entry.
