This is our second Newsletter of 2025 and this month I am going to use this space to update you on our community priorities.

Community Priorities

In January you may recall that we had recently set out our community priorities. These are set by the public utilising an online survey. This consultation along with the use of our Policing intelligence and information systems allows us to focus on areas of concern. These priorities are refreshed every three months.

Anti-Social behaviour: Whilst ASB continues to be a concern to the Public we are pleased to inform you that between 01/04/2024 -15/03/2025 there were 74 incidents of ASB recorded, this is an 18% decrease from the previous year of 90 incidents. The team have been focusing their attention on Hamden Park, Wendover and The Red Kite Centre, Aston Clinton/ Patrols have been completed at significant times. The team have been engaging with residents and those in the local vicinity. There have been no significant concerns raised. As we enter the next strategic year within TVP the team will be having greater involvement in ASB, specifically around personal ASB which affect individuals. ASB continues to be a priority for our neighbourhood team and forms part of our strategic plan for 2025/2026.

Burglary: Burglary is an intrusive crime which can affect anyone and therefore it is no surprise that it features high on your concerns. Throughout the winter months we have had a targeted campaign to raise awareness of how to keep protect your property. Our patrols have focused around our move vulnerable and remote locations. We have been actively providing crime prevention advice, please sign-up to our social media channels on twitter or Facebook for regular crime prevention advice. The team has also completed 'cocooning' in areas that have seen burglaries to provide specific crime prevention advice to those residents.

Speeding: Speeding has also been an area of focus and over the last quarter and the team have led several operations. The areas of focus have included, A413, Wendover bypass, South Street, Worlds End, Tring Road, Aylesbury Road and Tring Hill. In February's operation 3 vehicles were stopped travelling at 38-40mph in a 30mph area and

one in excess of 45mph. The team have also worked with dedicated officers from our traffic department, targeting speeding, No tax and no insurance.
