



The Wing team welcomes PCSO Mike Coker who joins us on the 12th April.


Haddenham & Waddesdon:

Other News









The below is just a snapshot of what each of the neighbourhood teams have been doing over the last few months:

Operation Acre: Neighbourhood Police Teams from across the area, along with members of the Rural Crime Task Force, completed three nights of intensified efforts to tackle rural crime and its impact on local communities. Local farmers and stakeholders were invited to participate. Numerous vehicle stops and seizures were made, and suspects were detained at a rural burglary scene.

Buckingham University and Hunter Street Railway Walk: Buckingham officers responded to reports of anti-social behaviour around the university campus and the Hunter Street Railway Walk bridge. Those involved have been identified and issued with Out of Court Disposals, with a requirement to engage in diversion programmes deemed appropriate by the Youth Justice Unit.

Attempted Child Abduction Arrest: Buckingham officers assisted other departments in identifying and compiling incidents related to the arrest of a male for attempted child abduction offences in Buckingham. The suspect has been charged and remanded to custody.


Anti-Social Behaviour Patrols: Buckingham officers continue to patrol public spaces in and around the town to deter anti-social behaviour. Over March, the team completed seven positive stop searches, issued Out of Court disposals, and referred individuals to diversion programmes as directed by the Youth Justice Unit.

Community Engagement: Buckingham officers attended the Buckingham University Fresher's Fair and local secondary schools to discuss community safety, particularly focusing on violence against women and girls. They also participated in the quarterly Buckinghamshire Contextual Safeguarding Meeting with representatives from local primary and secondary schools to address ongoing safeguarding concerns.

Criminal Behaviour Order Enforcement: Sandra Taylor of Spicers Yard, Haddenham, was sentenced to 8 weeks in prison after multiple breaches of her Criminal Behaviour Order (CBO) which had been obtained by the Waddesdon team. Despite numerous warnings and chances to reform, Taylor continued to disregard the conditions set by the order.

Safer Business Week: PCSO Fahy and PCSO Stephenson, along with volunteers from Waddesdon police station, engaged with various businesses across the Waddesdon & Haddenham policing area during Safer Business Week in March 2025. They successfully signed up 22 new businesses to DISC (an initiative designed to support the fight against









shopliftings) and multiple individuals to Thames Valley Alerts.

Shoplifting in Haddenham: Shoplifting remains a priority for our officers. They have been engaging with staff members and dealing with offenders, leading to charges and fines being issued over the past few months.

Speed Enforcement: The Winslow team conducted speed enforcement in Winslow, Whitchurch, and Great Horwood. Several vehicles were stopped, and drivers were advised about their speeding. One driver was reported for driving at 45mph on Oving Road, Whitchurch, and will receive 3 penalty points and a £100 fine. Speed enforcement checks will continue in the town and villages.

Farm Patrols: Following a series of farm thefts in the Winslow, Buckingham, and Wing areas, patrols have been carried out to look for suspicious vehicles and individuals. Several vehicles have been stopped and checked. Proactive patrols will continue to target suspicious activity.

Drug Possession: Anti-social behaviour reports have been low, but patrols have identified individuals in possession of drugs, who have been dealt with appropriately.

Dog Seizures: Officers from the Winslow team have seized several dogs causing issues to neighbours. These dogs have been re-homed.


Housing Association Collaboration: We are working with the local housing association to address anti-social and criminal behaviour within their properties in Buckingham and Winslow. Evidence is being gathered for a closure order on a property.

School Engagement: Winslow Officers have been building relationships with staff and pupils at Sir Thomas Freemantle School. A knife arch was used to search all pupils, and thankfully no knives were found. We also visited Great Horwood Primary School, where we introduced ourselves to the foundation and reception classes and answered their many questions. The Wing team also carried out a knife arch operation at the Cottesloe School with similar positive results.

Arrests: The team has made several arrests, including domestic violence offenders and drink drivers.

TFMV Series Update: At the beginning of the year, there was a noticeable spike in Theft from Motor Vehicle (TFMV) offences, particularly targeting tradespersons' tools across our area. These incidents were linked to similar offences in Bedfordshire and Hertfordshire, with most occurring in villages near the county borders. Arrests have been









made following one report, and the spike in offences appears to have subsided. While we are still experiencing these offences, they are now sporadic.

Stoke Hammond Neighbourhood Issues: The Wing team has been working closely with a housing association to address ongoing issues on Roman Field. This collaboration is resource-intensive but crucial for maintaining community safety and well-being.


