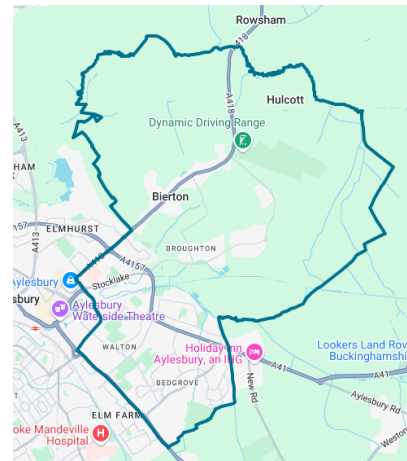

The East Team

The Aylesbury East Community Policing team consists of Police Constable Olivia Pinnells and Olivia Larsen along with community support officers Isabelle Fincher and Thomas Moslin.

Halloween: Spooky season was a busy time for the East Neighbourhood Team, leading to lots of patrols and targeting of ASB. The team looked out for youths that were reported to be causing trouble in Jansel Square. During this, focus was made on gathering details and intel of the youths frequently seen in the area. This led to a successful and positive outcome as the team were able to provide suitable words of advice to the young people in Jansel Square. The ASB in Jansel Square and surrounding areas continues to be a targeted area for the East Team, with regular patrols completed frequently to dissuade future ASB.



Firework Fiascos: Fireworks are a sight to see for the communities of Aylesbury, and Guy Fawkes night and Diwali certainly kept the East Team busy! Fireworks were frequently being set off along communal areas and on roads of housing estates in areas such as Kingsbrook and Bedgrove. Officers quickly attended to give the revellers advice for them to enjoy their evening safely. Fireworks were removed from unsuitable areas and officers engaged with the community, and advised of suitable locations away from the road side.

Community Engagement: We have worked closely alongside Mediation by completing a Have Your Say In Jansel Square engaging with multiple members of public and providing advice. The mediation team have helped with ongoing incident between neighbours resolving the issue.

School Events: The East Team have enjoyed special visits to Kingsbrook Primary School, having a fun time engaging with the pupils and teaching them about road safety. The children enjoyed the morning, where officers gave a school talk about road safety with Traffic Officers who showed the children the speed gun. The children were able to look inside the police car and even put the lights and sirens. The team also attended Turnfurlong School where they introduced themselves to the children and explained the roles of PCSO and Police officers. The children were able to ask lots of questions and were provided guidance about online safety. Kingsbrook View Preschool was also visited,

where officers completed a school talk and pupils were also able to sit in the police car and speak down the radio.

The team also attended the 5th Aylesbury cubs at The Grange, where they provided advice about stranger danger, online safety and home safety in the colder months. The cubs were then able to try Police uniform on and see how heavy the kit is. They were all informative and exciting events where we may have inspired some future police officers!

Throw Overs: The Team have been working closely with HMP Aylesbury in regards to ongoing throw overs. They have worked with the prison team to create a leaflet providing advice for the local residents and what to look out for.

Speeding Concerns: Speeding is a frequent concern in our villages. While speed enforcement can hold speeding motorists accountable, research indicates it is not the most effective deterrent. Instead, road layouts and other measures prove more successful. Nevertheless, our neighbourhood team has acquired speed guns and has been actively monitoring and catching speeding drivers. We will focus our speed enforcement efforts on areas identified by the community as problematic. If speeding is a concern to you, please look to become involved in the community speed watch programme (link at the end of the newsletter).

Parking Concerns: Parking is a common issue across all our areas, often leading to neighbourhood disputes and community tension. We provide advice on an individual basis and, in some cases, work with schools to send polite notices to parents where parking is an issue during drop-off and pick-up times. We also patrol during these times, leaving notices and issuing tickets where applicable. Consideration notices stating that Thames Valley Police (TVP) are aware and monitoring have been issued in peak areas to act as a deterrent in the absence of road markings.
