### Meet the team..

Our dedicated Neighbourhood Policing Team is here to serve and support you. The team is led by Inspector James Davies. Inspector Davies has responsibility for the teams in the North of Buckinghamshire. Police Sergeant Clare Farrow leads Princes Risborough along with Aylesbury Town centre and Wendover Neighbourhood teams



We are really happy to have seen an increase in the Neighbourhood team. Since our last news letter we now have PC Bryony Powell who joined us from Gerrards Cross Neighbourhood team, PC Amy Batkin who joins from Amersham response team and PCSO Alex Cabbage who originally started in Chepping. We are really excited to have everyone on board.



Our neighbourhood officers are committed to addressing local issues and work collaboratively with partner agencies, including the council, housing associations, and other emergency services, to tackle long-term challenges. You might often see them patrolling your area, ensuring your safety and well-being. \*\*\*Please note that if you report a crime or incident via '999', '101', or an online report, you will likely be assisted by our response officers or detectives, who are different from the Neighbourhood Team.

### Community Priorities

Our teams are focused on community-identified priorities, gathered through an online survey, to direct their efforts over the next three months. The current issues that have been raised as priorities are as follows:

- Anti Social behaviour
- Burglary
- Speeding.

### Other News

The below is just a snapshot of what each of the neighbourhood team has been doing over the last few months:

**Speeding Operation:** Recently members of the team have been trained on using Speed gun which will allow us to run our own Speeding operations. In December PCSO Cabbage ran a speeding Operation within Longwick, Princes Risborough, Ellesborough. We issued three warnings and three tickets were issued.

**Op Purchase:** This is TVPs response to retail crime. The team have been working hard to engage with retailers. We have signed businesses onto DISC, an online reporting and intelligence system specifically for retailers. This has seen an increase in confidence in Policing.

**Shoplifting offender:** Following an increase in Shoplifting in M&S PC Neal worked with the store, identified the suspect and secured 9 charges against him. He is due in court on 27/01/2025 and we are happy to report no further offences have been reported in relation to him.

**ASB:** Princes Risborough has two hotspot patrol areas, the High Street and Wades Park. This has focused both the Neighbourhood teams patrols and also the response teams patrols. We also continue to work with partner in relation to local ASB within residential areas.

**Vulnerable adult:** We are currently supporting a vulnerable female with believed dementia to enable assessments and her safety and improve her quality of life.

**Have your Says:** The team ran six Have Your Says within Princes Risborough and the surrounding hamlets over the last three months, these events offer a platform for you to raise your concerns to the local team. **Events:** We have attended various events within the area, supporting partners from Buckinghamshire Council and the Town Council. The team were proud to be on patrol for the Christmas Light Switch on which was an excellent event as always. We have also supported events at the Chinnor Railway and the Young Farmers tractor run.

**Volunteers:** Police Sergeant Clare Farrow is looking to set up a Community team of volunteers to support our local Neighbourhood team. We also have volunteers that work with the team from community speed watch. More information on volunteering will be shared in the coming months through Neighbourhood watch, TV alerts and the Thames Valley Police recruitment pages.

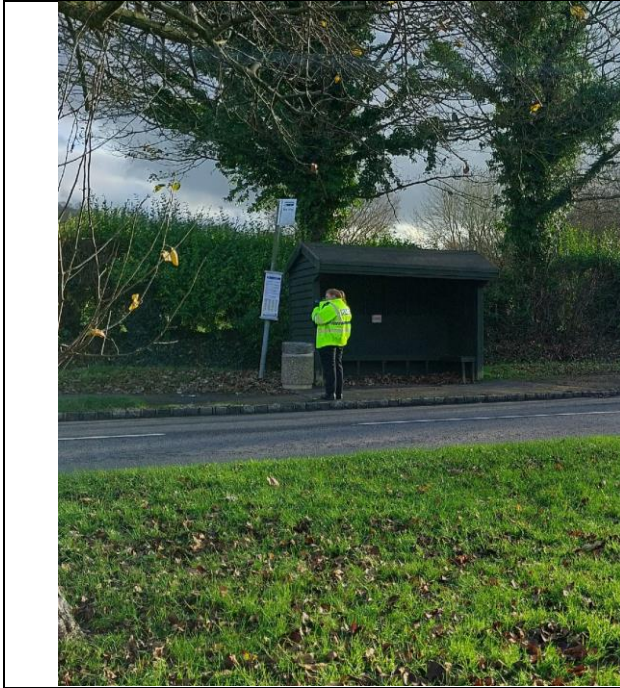
